A. 66.03.01 Inter-District Agreements - Project Search Program Agreement

BS-1 Motion by John Krings, seconded by Katherine Bielski-Medina, to approve the 66.03.01 cooperative agreement with the Nekoosa School District for the students attending the Project Search program. Motion carried unanimously.

B. Purchase of District Mini Vans
