Notes from Nurse Nichole:

Even though fall has just begun, the temperatures are already dropping! Please make sure you are sending appropriate outside clothing with your student(s) - hat, gloves, winter jackets). Along with weather changes comes illness. Please keep your student home if they have a temperature of 100.4 or greater, vomiting, and /or diarrhea or if they just are not feeling well enough to attend school.

Also, if your student has a history of asthma and they need an inhaler, please make sure they have their inhaler at school and a med. order from the doctor for use. Asthma exacerbation / flare up is very common due to weather changes.

Vaccinations - We will be excluding non- compliant students this year. The first legal notice was mailed on 9/25. If you have received a notice, but believe your student is compliant with their vaccinations/waivers, please contact your nurse.

Deadline for Vaccination Compliance is Monday, October 16, 2023.

As always, if your student has fever of 100.4 or greater, vomitting, or diarrhea, they need to remain home for 24 hours fever-free w/o using fever-reducing medications and be vomit/diarrhea free for 24hrs after the episode
