ONLINE ENROLLMENT VERIFICATION

If you have not already completed the online enrollment verification please do ASAP. It is VERY IMPORTANT for parents to complete this to verify that all of your contact information in Skyward is correct. Make sure at least one emergency contact is listed with the correct phone number. Fill out the medical information in detail so that the office can treat the students effectively. Also, if anything changes, phone numbers, addresses, health issues please update them in Skyward throughout the year. If you need help completing the online verification, please contact the office and they will be happy to assist you.

AFTER SCHOOL PLANS

Parents please communicate with your child(ren) the plan for after school before leaving for school in the morning. Please call the office by 2:00pm if changes need to be made for pick up of your child(ren).

ALL STUDENTS will be picked up in the back parking lot near the ACT playground, unless you have indicated to the office you will be walking up to Door B off the playground to meet your child(ren). Bus students will be picked up in the front parking lot by the office. Please follow those pick up guidelines through out the year. Older grades, if you feel comfortable can be picked up on Clyde Street, Lincoln Street instead of going through the drive up line.

VOLUNTEERS

Anyone interested in volunteering during 2023/2024 school year must complete a background check. This includes chaperoning field trips. You can apply on the WRPS website under the community tab. If you completed a background check last year or the year before, you should not complete the background check this year. Background checks are good for 3 years.

September News from the Nurse

Hi everyone,! Hoping your first days back to school have been wonderful and you're all settling in for another fantastic year! A few reminders:

CARE PLANS FOR HEALTH CONDITIONS

Emails have been sent with paperwork if your student has been identified as having a health condition (food allergies, lactose intolerance, asthma, allergies to bee stings, seizure disorders, etc.) Please make sure to fill these out and send them back ASAP to the office. This is important to help keep your student safe while at school. If you haven't received an email, make sure to check your junk folder first, otherwise contact the school office and they will be happy to assist you.

MEDICATIONS

Students requiring administration of prescription medication (including short term antibiotics) at school must have a PHYSICIAN/DENTIST
ORDERS FOR ADMINISTERING PRESCRIPTION MEICATION IN SCHOOL form on file in the nurse's office. This form and additional health forms (seizures, migraine, inhalers, food allergies, bee allergies) may be found on the WRPS webpage. Any medication identified as a controlled substance must be delivered to the school office by a responsible adult. These medications must be in a pharmacy labeled container. All over the counter meds (Tylenol, cough drops etc.) must be given to the nurse/office staff in the original labeled bottle.

COVID GUIDELINES

Student who present symptoms should stay home until feeling better. If a fever is present, they should stay home until fever free for 24 hours (without using fever reducing medication). There are no masking stipulations.


Bright by Text is a free program that sends tips and resources for healthy child development to parents' & caregivers' cell phones.




