Getting from place to place: Doors open at 8:30. The bell rings at 8:45. Students are dismissed at 3:30.

Walkers: We are lucky to have sidewalks, safety patrol members, and a crossing guard to help get our students to school safely. Please use crosswalks, sidewalks, and paths while walking to school.

Bike Riders: Please walk bikes while on school property. Bike riders will use the same crosswalks as walkers and must walk bikes behind the school to the bike racks, closest to 28th St.

Busers: Busers arrive at school at 8:30. Busing details are found in Skyward.

Drop Off and Pick Up: Adults may walk student up to the drop off island or remain in the pick up line to drop off or pick up. Walk up parking is located on the north end of the parent parking area.


Another way to support our FundRun is to sponsor a class snack when they finish their run.


Medications:

WRPS has changed content filtering programs over the summer. We are no longer using Securly and have now transitioned to Blocksi. This program will keep students safe at school and home when using their school-issued devices and accounts. As a partner in your child's education, we feel it is of value to give you access to the Blocksi manager. In the parent dashboard, you'll have a real-time view of your child's activity on their school device or account. In addition to these features, you will be able to block specific categories such as social media and gaming on your child's school device or account when they are logged in at home. Blocksi also has the capability to pause the internet at home. You will also be notified of any flagged activities pointing to self-harm or bullying related to your child.

You will receive an email invitation to Blocksi to set up your parent dashboard. You can also access the dashboard via an app available for Android and iOS devices. You can web-based version by navigating https://blocksi.net/bmee-parent.php.

If you receive an email or error indicating your email address is not found, verify in your Skyward account that you are using the correct email address. If you are unable to verify your email address, please reach out to your child's school secretary to make sure you have a valid email address on file.
