Absences must be reported to the office!

If your student is not well enough to come to school or will be missing school for any other reason, please report their absence to the office through Skyward or call the attendance line: (715)424-6788, press 1.

If absences remain unreported, they will be marked unexcused. The legal statute defines a "habitual truant" as a student who is absent or tardy from school without an acceptable excuse for part or all of five or more days during a term. Students may not be absent more than a total of ten days.

If you are having difficulty with your child attending school or being on time, please call the school for assistance.
