If your student is not well enough to come to school or will be missing school for any other reason, please report their absence to the office through Skyward or call the attendance line: (715)424-6788, press 1.

If absences remain unreported, they will be marked unexcused. The legal statute defines a "habitual truant" as a student who is absent or tardy from school without an acceptable excuse for part or all of five or more days during a term. Students may not be absent more than a total of ten days.



Currently serving over 400 youth, Boys & Girls Club programs provide much needed after-school care, while helping youth develop character and build academic & life skills.

Healthy lifestyles are learned through physical activity, healthy habits, and social emotional learning. The Second Step program teaches members how to identify, understand, and manage emotions.

STEM activities ignite interest in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics, while creative arts projects encourage self-expression and artistic appreciation.

Club members also get fun and unique opportunities to participate in programs like NBA Math Hoops which teaches math & social emotional skills through basketball over a 12-week program.

Committed to all ages, the Teen Center offers programs like Career Launch for job-ready teens to learn important soft skills; and Teen Cuisine, for hands-on cooking instruction.
