One month in, the weather has cooled our building, and students are finding their lockers and classrooms without having to look at schedules or maps. I am happy to report that the school year is off to a GREAT start! The two lunch periods are working well now that all of our cafeteria tables have arrived, been arranged affording the most space for students, and our kitchen staff and aides are moving students through the lines with plenty of time to eat. # Just a few reminders:

- Drop off and pick up of students is on 6th street. For the safety of our students, please do not drop off or pick up at Taco John's parking lot or on Peach Street.
- The use of cell phones and other electronic devices during the school day (7:30-2:38) is against school rules. If you need to contact your child during the school day, please call the office and we will give them your message.



- If you have not done so, please check Skyward to access your child's current grades. If you have trouble accessing or need help with user name and password, please call the Student Services office (715)424-6735 and we will help you.
- ◆ 488 out of the 740 families at East Junior High have completed the Online Registration Verification through Skyward as required by the district. If you have not completed this for your student, please do so as soon as possible. If you need help with this process, call the Student Services office at the number listed above and they will be glad to help you. In order for your student to receive certain over the counter medications at school your authorization must be given while completing the Online Verification process.



Freshman Focus (previously Freshmen Fridays)...will be held on Thursday, October 17 during Eagle Time. The topic for October will be study skills and note taking. At the September Freshman Friday, all Freshmen set goals for the school year. Stop and see your child's guidance counselor at conferences to see your son or daughter's goals.

# **SPORTS PHYSICALS**

All athletes are required to have a physical examination before trying out for a sport or practicing with a team. Sports physicals are required every two years with an alternate year card due in the opposite year. It is extremely important that this paperwork is completed prior to tryouts. Under no circum-



stances will an athlete be able to tryout for a team without a current sports physical.

Other forms that are required of all athletes are the Code of Conduct, Concussion Form and Medical Emergency Card as well as the WIAA rules form for Freshmen.



Yearbooks... During the last week of October, East Junior High students will have the opportunity to order their Junior High Yearbooks. The basic book will cost \$25.00. The students will have the chance to purchase options such as name stamping, autograph pages or plastic covers at an additional cost. Jostens, our yearbook company, will send a bill home to the parents sometime in late November. Three bills will be sent home between late November and middle January. You will have the option to pay in 1 or 2 installments, with a check, money order, credit card or online. You may also change or cancel the order when you receive the first bill. All payments must be sent to Jostens by the end of January in order to secure your child's yearbook for the end of the year. Only students ordering a book at the end of October will be guaranteed a book at the end of the school year. If we have any extra books at the end of the year, they would be sold for \$30.00 each. Please do not send any money to the school for yearbooks. We will not take any yearbook Company during the latter part of this year.
