Cell Phone Policy

ELECTRONIC DEVICES / MOBILE PHONES

The use of cell phones and other electronic devices (including portable speakers and smartwatches) during instructional time is prohibited during class time. Cell phones are only allowed during school hours in the cafeteria during lunch, in the hallways between classes, and the privileged/commons study hall time. Students may also not wear Airpods, earbuds, headphones, etc-during class periods. All electronic devices should be kept in classroom cell phone pockets or in a student's locker. If a student is found using a cell phone during an unauthorized time:

First Infraction

- Teacher confiscates cell phone and turns the device into the main office.
- Teacher submits a discipline referral form & makes a parent contact.
- Student may be sent to the in school suspension room for the rest of the class period and additional consequences for insubordination.
- Student will receive one detention.
- Student picks up phone from the Main Office at the end of the school day.

Second Infraction

- Teacher confiscates cell phone and turns the device into the main office.
- Teacher submits a discipline referral form.
- Student may be sent to the in school suspension room for the rest of the class period and additional consequences for insubordination.
- Student will receive one detention.
- Parents will be contacted by the Main Office and will be required to come to school to retrieve the phone.

Third Infraction

- Teacher confiscates cell phone and turns the device into the main office.
- Teacher submits a discipline referral form.
- Student will be suspended to the in school suspension room for the remainder of the school day.
- Student will receive two detentions.
- Student will lose PRIDE privileges for the remainder of the term.
- Parents will be contacted by the Main Office and will be required to come to school to retrieve the phone.

Students unwilling to turn the phone over to the administration will be out of school suspended. Mobile Phones are not used in restrooms and locker rooms. Video recording in these areas is strictly prohibited.

Attendance Matters!

Regular school attendance is crucial for students' academic and emotional success. Frequent absences can cause students to fall behind in class content and miss out on homework, which reinforces the skills taught in school. When students fall behind, it often leads to increased stress and anxiety about missed assignments and classwork. This overwhelming sense of being unable to catch up can result in students shutting down, which may ultimately lead to failing grades.

Attendance (p. 12)

10 absences allowed per year

WI State Law allows parents or guardians to excuse their student(s) for up to 10 days
 Absences after 10 days are subject to truancy
 Whenever you have a professional appointment (dentist/doctor/chiropractor/etc.) a medical excuse, brought to the office DOES NOT count towards those 10 days
 The best reminder is, when you have an appointment always bring a professional note!

Attendance (p. 13) **Tardies**

1st Period Tardy into!

- All students must report to the office immediately if arriving late to school 1st hour
- Parents can only excuse their child late to school two times per term
 Each time thereafter, there will be a consequence administered up to a truancy
- Detentions will be assigned via email
- Medical excuses or appointments
 will be considered excused

Being on time is an important habit to get into! **Periods RPT-5 Tardies**

- Students will be held accountable for getting to class on time
 Consequences are administered for being tardy to class
 Detentions will be assigned via email
 If there is a pattern of behavior, your son/daughter will be
 - referred for truancy

Dress Code (pp. 16-17)

Dress for Success

Basic Principle: Certain body parts must be covered for all students at all times. All items listed in the "must wear" and "may wear" categories below must meet this basic principle.

Students Must Wear, while following the basic principle of Section 1:

- A shirt (with fabric in the front, back, and on the sides under the arms), AND
- Pants/jeans or the equivalent (for example, a skirt, sweatpants, leggings, a dress or shorts),
- AND shoes.
- Hats and hooded sweatshirts (or, *hoodies*) <u>may</u> be worn. Staff may request for you to pull down your hoodie or remove your hat.
- No coats, chains, sunglasses, flags, or blankets can be worn.
- Clothing that distracts from the learning process, displays suggestive or offensive graphics or statements, or pertains to drugs, alcohol or tobacco products is not permitted.

Important Policies: Cell Phones (pp. 17-18)

Backpacks

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- Use and possession is prohibited during instructional time unless approved by teacher and administration (this will be rare).
 - Allowed during lunch, in the hallways between classes, and in commons study halls.
- Cell phones will be confiscated and turned over to school admin if used inappropriately.
- Backpacks are up to teacher discretion in classrooms

- Student will receive two detentions.
- Student will lose PRIDE privileges for the remainder of the term.
- Parents will be contacted by the Main Office and will be required to come to school to retrieve the phone.

Grading (pp. 8-9)

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Grading Information

School-wide Grading Scale

Common School-Wide Weighting of Grades

- Summative assessments (80%) will be used to determine a majority of the student's grade. They more accurately reflect what students really know and can do. Summative assessments are assessments of learning.
- Formative assessments/Practice (20%) are assessments for learning. The goal of a formative assessment is to monitor student learning to provide ongoing feedback that can be used by instructors to improve their teaching and by students to improve their learning.

Retake/Re-Perform of Summative Assessments

- Students will be allowed to retake/re-perform a minimum of two summative assessments per trimester if a student achieves below an 80%. The student will follow the retake policy/re-perform ticket that each course has developed.
- Extra Credit
 - There will be no individual extra credit assignments or extra credit points on assessments.

Some courses have different requirements due to university or external factors.

Academics (pp. 4-5) Academic Integrity

Formative

- Note in discipline record.
- 1st Offense Will receive up to an 80% on an alternative assignment.
- 2nd Offense Will receive a zero for the assignment.

Summative

- Note in discipline record.
 Will serve a school consequence.
 <u>Ineligible</u> for National Honor Society.
 Referral for a co-curricular code violation.
- 1st Offense--Will receive a maximum of 59% on retake or alternative task.
 2nd and subsequent offenses during a high school career--Will receive a zero for the summative assessment.

It is designed to reward students who meet the qualifications. This opportunity for our students is a privilege, **not a right**. Any form of disrespect or abuse of privileges will result in immediate loss of privileges.




