- School supplies and waived fees for other class related activities
- Free breakfast and lunch program
- Special education services if appropriate
- Tutoring programs if needed
- Gifted & Talented programs if appropriate
- Summer school programs if needed
- Pre-school programs if appropriate
- After-school programs if available
- Referrals to other district and community resources as needed

Purpose of the program...

Promote academic success by removing barriers for students who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence.

Who is eligible...

Children & Youth living in:

- Emergency or transitional shelters
- Motels, hotels, campgrounds, abandoned in hospitals
- A car, park, public place, bus station, abandoned building, or any other unsheltered situation
- A relative or friend's home
- Runaway, unaccompanied, or abandoned youth



Every student experiencing homelessness has the right to...

- Attend school regularly despite frequent moves
- Be enrolled in school without records from the previous school
- Remain in the school the child has been attending regardless of housing circumstances
- Participate in school programs and extracurricular activities
- Obtain basic items such as food, clothing, transportation, and school supplies necessary to learn and be successful in school

If you are experiencing homelessness...

- Update your child's school about any new changes in address
- Inform your child's teacher, principal, social worker, or school counselor if you wish for your child to remain in their home school
- Keep a copy of your child's birth certificates, school records, health/immunization records if possible
- Contact a WRPS Social Worker, School Counselor, or Families in Transition Coordinator with any questions.
