The end of Term 2 was today. Students do not have school tomorrow. Term 3 begins on Monday, March 4th.

Good luck to our wrestling team as they compete at the WIAA Team State Wrestling Tournament tomorrow and hopefully Saturday at the UW Field House in Madison. The schedule and more information are below.

Tomorrow and Saturday our Athletic Department hosts the WIAA Division 1 State Gymnastics Championships in the LHS Field House. We will welcome over 4,000 participants and spectators to Rapids. The schedule is below.

A reminder to parents that student drop-off in the morning must occur in the student parking lot along the curb. Drop-off should not be occurring in the front lot until after 7:30 a.m.

Advanced Placement (AP) testing occurs in the first two weeks of May. Payment for AP tests is due by March 6th. If payment is not received, students will be unable to test. A link to the form is here.

As we continue to develop our master teaching and class schedule for next school year, we are adding a step of verification in the process. Beginning on Tuesday, March 5th through Friday, March 15th, primary and alternate courses that students requested will be visible in Skyward. On Tuesday, March 5th during RPT, students will receive their selections on paper. **This MUST be returned to the student's RPT teacher by Friday, March 15th either stating the course selections are correct or changes may need to be made.** If sheets are not returned, we will assume all primary and alternate course selections are accurate. Counselors will be available from March 18th through 20th to discuss changes. After this date, schedule changes will not be made unless an extenuating circumstance based upon our schedule change/course correction policy. Our staffing and budget decisions are based on course selections. It is vital that the student's course selections are accurate.

The Arts Council of South Wood County and Mead Witter Foundation are offering a hands-on songwriting session led by Steve Leslie, a Grammy-winning songwriter and professor who performs the music of James Taylor. Steve will take suggestions from the audience and talk them through the process of writing a song on the spot. We are beginning the state-required testing season. Juniors have a mandatory ACT exam on Tuesday, March 12th. Free ACT practice tests and preparation materials can be found on the <u>DPI ACT Practice Tests and Sample Items webpage</u>. Below is a graphic for test-taking skill activities in English, Reading, and Writing.

Sophomores will have the FORWARD exam the week of March 18th. Freshmen and sophomores will have the PreACT Secure exam on April 9th. More information will be coming soon.

Please encourage your child to do their best on this

assessment. Earlier this year, LHS earned the highest school report card grade among conference and neighboring high schools.



Seniors will be participating in the **"Reality Check"** financial simulation requirement for graduation along with community engagement and round table discussions with business and industry professionals from 7:30 a.m. to 11:55 a.m. on Tuesday, March 12th. **This is a requirement for graduation.** If a senior does not complete this, they will be assigned an online reality check lesson to complete during Term 3. More information is in the February newsletter. Senior yard signs will be sold for \$20.00 immediately following Reality Check. Look for the CRZ table when you are done in the morning.

Freshmen and Sophomores will have brief work posted in Canvas for March 12th. In-person attendance is NOT required on March 12th for these two grade levels. Freshmen and Sophomores have mandatory state testing on Tuesday, April 9th. Juniors and Seniors will not attend in-building instruction on this date.

On March 12th buses will run as usual but most students will complete Reality Check around 11:30 a.m. and ACT testing around 1:00 p.m. If the parent completes this form, the student will be dismissed from school after ACT testing or Reality Check is complete.

Is your child looking for employment? If so, have them sign up to attend the **Teen Job Fair**. It is on Wednesday, March 20th, from 2:00-5:00 p.m. at Lincoln High School. All teens must register to attend by clicking <u>here</u>. Those who register in advance are entered into a prize drawing. They can also register at the door but are not eligible to win prizes.

There will also be an area for application help. Students who have never filled out an application or are unsure of what an application is asking can speak with one of our friendly volunteers. Multiple employers are ready to review applications and do onsite interviews during the job fair.

When you arrive, please park in the student parking lot. You will need to walk around the Performing Arts Center and enter the school through the main entrance. Any adults must have a valid Driver's License and check into the office if entering the building during the school day.


