Make-Up State Assessment and Reality Check Information

- Juniors who did not complete the ACT state test will have make-up testing on Tuesday, April 9th at 7:30 a.m. in the Learning Commons Flex Room.
- Sophomores who did not complete the social studies-based Forward Exam will have their make-up on Thursday, April 11th at 7:30 a.m. in the Auxiliary Gym.
- Seniors who did not complete the Reality Check have received via email their alternative assignment from Mr. Siler. This must be completed for graduation.

Freshmen and Sophomores will be administered the PreACT Secure on Tuesday, April 9th. Juniors and Seniors may have brief work posted in Canvas for April 9th. In-person attendance is NOT required on *April 9th* for Juniors and Seniors. Upon completion of testing, all students will have a study hall unless the parent completes [this form to dismiss their child for the remainder of the day](#). Students who do not complete this assessment on April 9th will have the make-up on Thursday, April 11th at 7:30 a.m. in the Auxiliary Gym.

On April 8th, a total solar eclipse will be making its way across North America. **We are hoping for good weather!**

- We will be conducting a viewing of the event for students, faculty, and staff members who wish to participate. Students will have an extended 5th period (schedule below) when, at an appropriate time, classes will be escorted outside to view the eclipse. Our staff will also be conducting a community viewing session outside the South Wood County Recreation Center/Rapids Area Sports Complex.
- Safety is our top priority, and we would like both you and your student to be aware of the precautionary steps we are putting in place. Homemade or ordinary sunglasses are not sufficient ways to view an eclipse, as the reflectivity and polarization are not high enough for viewing safely. To ensure that each participant is safe, we will be supplying those who wish to participate with a pair of glasses specifically designed for eclipse viewing. If you wish for your child not to participate in the viewing, please complete this [form](#) and return it to the main office by Friday, April 5th.



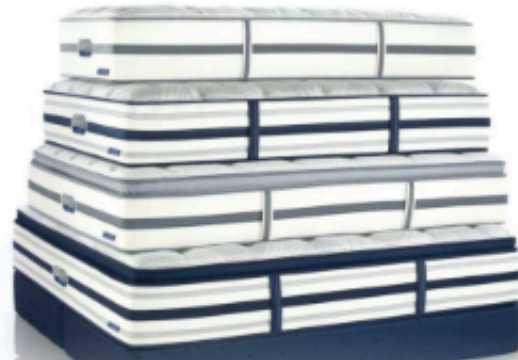

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I get directly admitted?

You must be enrolled in a participating high school and agree to participate in the program. If you are on track to complete the credits required for admission, you will receive an admission offer through Direct Admit Wisconsin based on your unweighted GPA at the end of your junior year.

What is the deadline to opt in/opt out?

Students and families in the Class of 2025 must agree to participate by June 3, 2024. Ask your high school counselor how to participate.

Do I need to submit my ACT or SAT scores to participate in Direct Admit Wisconsin?

No, test scores are not part of the Direct Admit Wisconsin admission criteria. However, a student may need to submit test scores to their selected university for scholarships or course placement.

What happens if I am not direct admitted to my UW university of interest, or I want to apply to a non-participating university?

Students can and should apply through the traditional online application process for any UW university they want to attend that is not listed in the Direct Admit letter. The application allows students to provide more information about their academic potential, participation in activities, and life circumstances. Some UW universities accept the Common App.

When will students receive their Direct Admit Wisconsin offer of admission?

Direct Admit Wisconsin offer letters will be sent out in July 2024.

Is there a deadline to accept my offer?

Yes. You must complete the Direct Admit form by May 1, 2025.
