This a reminder that all Juniors will be required to take the ACT plus Writing on Tuesday, March 7th.

On Tuesday, October 17th, students can take the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude and Battery (ASVAB). It will be administered at Lincoln High School beginning at 12:00. It can take up to 3 hours but most students finish before that. Please know this test is not required and is only for students who are interested in taking the test. Taking the ASVAB test does not mean your child has to enlist in the military! Sign up in the ACP Center.


