October 2022 News From Nurse Tasha

I hope everyone has had a great start to the school year! Please review the following information:

COVID GUIDELINES

In an effort to get back to pre-COVID measures, we are no longer excluding students due to a certain number of symptoms. If they are not feeling well and it is determined that they should not be at school, they will be sent home. Once their symptoms have improved, they can return to school (whether it be the following school day or not). If they are sick before the school day starts, please do not send them to school.

As prior to COVID, any student with vomiting, diarrhea, and/or fever will be required to stay home for 24 hours after the last episode or 24 hours fever free without the use of fever reducing medication.

Home tests are allowed to be used for documentation of a negative and positive test. Please keep in mind that it is not required to test your student(s). Each school has a limited supply of COVID tests; please ask the office if you are in need.

POSITIVE COVID TEST

Please notify your students' school if they test positive for COVID. They will need to remain home for 5 days after symptom onset and mask the remainder of the 5 days.

COVID EXPOSURE (CLOSE CONTACT)

Please notify your students' school for further information if they have been exposed to COVID.

VISION SCREENING

The nurses are in the process of setting up vision screening through the Lioness Club at the elementary schools for all grades. Please be on the lookout for more information and permission slips being sent home with your child(ren) over the next month.

VACCINATIONS/LEGAL NOTICES

Notices for those missing required immunizations have been/are being sent home. Students' who are not compliant will be excluded from school until a waiver is signed or an appointment has been scheduled. (A link for a waiver can be found here). If you have an appointment scheduled already, please let your school nurse know.

<u>Age/Grade Required Immunizations (Number of Doses)</u>

2 years through 4 years 4 DTP/DTaP/DT, 3 Polio, 1 MMR, 1 Var, 3 Hep B, 3 Hib4, 3 PCV5

Kindergarten through grade 5 4 DTP /DTaP/DT/Td1, 4 Polio, 2 MMR, 2 Var3, 3 Hep B

Grade 6 through grade 8 4 DTP/DTaP/DT/Td, 1 Tdap2, 4 Polio, 2 MMR, 2 Var3, 3 Hep B

Grade 9 through grade 12 4 DTP/DTaP/DT/Td, 1 Tdap2, 4 Polio, 2 MMR, 2 Var3, 3 Hep B
