News From The Nurse

One month left!!

We have already had several warmer days and this will continue so please make sure your student has any needed medication (inhalers, antihistamines) at school to help combat allergies. Any inhalers at school will need a doctor's order for them to be given. A written and signed note from parent/guardian giving consent for antihistamines is required. <u>*Please note that over the counter medications (antihistamines included) can only be given for 3 consecutive days unless a doctor's order is on file and states otherwise.</u>

Medications

As we near the end of another school year, we would like to remind parents/guardians that any over the counter medications, epipens, and inhalers that your student has at school will be sent home with them at the end of the year. Any controlled medication (seizure or ADHD) will need to be picked up by parent/guardian or other adult. If any extra medication is not picked up by the end of the year, it will be properly disposed of.

Mental Health Awareness Month
