Dear Grizzly Family,

What a fantastic September! It has been wonderful to see our students settle into the school year with such great enthusiasm and a readiness to learn.

As we move forward, one of our key school goals is to help students become more proficient with their math facts. Knowing math facts by heart is a foundational skill that allows students to tackle more complex problems with confidence and ease. We will be working on this in the classroom and would greatly appreciate your partnership at home.

Here are a few fun ways you can help your student with their math facts:

- Flashcard Fun. Make it a game! Time them to see how many they can get right in a minute or play a memory-card matching game.
- "War". Use a deck of cards (remove face cards or assign them a value). Each player flips over two cards and adds/multiplies them. The person with the higher sum/product wins the cards.
- Real-World Math. Practice while you're out and about. For example: "if we have four (4) people and everyone needs two (2) slices of pizza, how many slices do we need in total?"

New this year, you'll receive a weekly ParentSqure message from me called "Bear" Necessities. This is a quick and concise update to help you keep track of important events and dates. 
