# Registration Considerations

**Fee:** \$5.00

This is the only class at school with cats and dogs in the classroom! Learn how to keep your pets happy, healthy, and safe with actual classroom animals. You will learn how to perform lifesaving procedures such as CPR and artificial respiration, make diagnoses, and analyze diets and nutrition. You will learn how to bandage an abrasion, stitch a wound, and address any major medical emergency. You will understand what it takes to effectively care for dogs and cats in any situation. This is an ideal class for anyone who loves caring for animals or who wants to pursue a career in a medical field. This class involves opportunities to work with live dogs and cats as well as various other species.
