Huglen in Room 229. No previous experience is necessary, just an eagerness to learn and become skilled in A/V media productions.





Academic and Career Planning Center

What can ACP do for you?

Your student may be able to tell you what ACP stands for, Academic and Career Planning, but have they taken advantage of any of the services offered? Below are some of the ways ACP can help:

1. Job shadowing

Let's help your student save time and money after high school by setting up a job shadow. Maybe they'll love it! Maybe they'll hate it! Either way, it's valuable information to help inform their decisions after high school. Students are allowed to job shadow up to 3 dates in their high school career.

2. Resume/Cover Letter Help

Does your student need a resume for a job or a Youth Apprenticeship? If they do and aren't sure where to start, the ACP Center can assist!

3. Volunteering Opportunities

Volunteering is a great way to gain soft skills and experience. It helps students learn more about themselves, their likes and dislikes, and also is a dopamine boost to help others! Volunteer opportunities are in the morning announcements, social media, as well as the ACP's volunteer page.

4. College

Let's answer your student's questions about applying to college, majors, campuses, financial aid, etc. Did you know students are allowed 2 excused days for campus visits? Also, the ACP Center coordinates two college field trips per year, one in the fall and one in the spring. And don't forget, students can also take Dual Credit and AP classes!

5. Military

The ACP Center can help students get in touch with recruiters, discuss the different branches of the military, and help them get set up for the ASVAB test that takes place at Lincoln.

6. Apprenticeship/trades

Need help with entering the trades after high school? Come discuss the possibilities and the process of entering the trades!

7. Employment

ACP can help students fill out job applications, find a job, and work on interviewing skills. There is an <u>online job</u> <u>board</u> as well as a bulletin board in the ACP Center where students can view current job postings.

We want your student to be prepared for life after high school, no matter what pathway they take or if it changes afterward. That preparation can start today! Have your child stop by and see Mrs. King in the ACP Center for assistance.

FROM THE NURSE

There are a lot of different viruses circulating this time of year. Please be cognizant when determining whether or not to send your student to school. <u>As a reminder, they are allowed 10 sick days throughout the year</u>. Anything covered by a doctor's excuse does not count towards the sick days. Please request a doctor's excuse anytime your student has an appointment or is seen for illness. If your child is having a fever (>100.4), vomiting, or diarrhea, please keep them home until 24 hours symptom-free with no medication use.

It is recommended to follow up with a healthcare provider if your student has been ill for 3 or more days.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The Department of Public Instruction (DPI) is required by state statute (Wis. Stat. 115.385) to generate a school report card and district report card for every publicly funded school and district in the state. The report cards are intended to help schools and districts use performance data to celebrate successes and improve their efforts to prepare students for their futures. These public report cards can be found online at: <u>http://dpi.wi.gov/accountability/report-cards</u>.

The current school report card is based on last year's performance during the 2022-23 school year. DPI encourages caution when interpreting scores and ratings. Multiple years of data impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic are used throughout the report card.

At the foundation of the report cards are four priority areas. Schools and districts receive a score for each priority area:

- Achievement proficiency in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics on the annual state assessments
- Growth year-to-year progress in ELA and math achievement
- Target Group Outcomes outcomes for students with the lowest test scores
- On-Track to Graduation reliable predictors of how successfully students are progressing toward completing their K-12 education

The priority area scores are aggregated into an overall accountability score, from 0 to 100. This score is displayed on the front page of the school or district report cards. It is important to note that the 0 to 100 accountability score is not a "percent correct" measurement and is not aligned with traditional 0-100 grading scales. Based on its score, a school or district receives one of five rating categories, from *Fails to Meet Expectations* to *Significantly Exceeds Expectations*, as well as corresponding one to five stars.

Dear WRPS Families,

Supporting students, their families, and our staff members' mental health continues to be a priority for Wisconsin Rapids Public Schools. WRPS has several available resources to meet these needs.

The District has continued our partnership which we began last year with Care Solace to provide students, their families, and staff access to mental health care coordination services at no cost. WRPS and Care Solace continue to focus on removing barriers in accessing mental health care. Care Solace streamlines communication and coordination to connect individuals with the right resources and appropriate level of



care. Individuals seeking mental health care now have a trusted companion to rely on. With a team of more than 500 dedicated Care Companions, Care Solace connects stakeholders within WRPS to licensed mental health and substance use treatment providers. Through a human-centered and technology supported approach, these Care Companions navigate the mental health care system on behalf of individuals, helping them find the perfect fit for their unique needs and insurance requirements. These multilingual Care Companions are available 24/7/365 ensuring inclusivity and accessibility for the entire school community. It is important to note that this service is an optional resource, available at your discretion, and is not mandatory. Care Solace is not an emergency response service or a direct mental health service provider. In the case of a life-threatening emergency, please call 9-1-1 or the National Suicide Hotline at 9-8-8. To learn more about Care Solace and its services, visit caresolace.org.

Students, staff, and families may access Care Solace services in two ways:

- Call (888) 515-0595 at any time. Support is available in 200+ languages. A dedicated Care Companion[™] will help you every step of the way to research options, secure appointments, and follow up to make sure it is a good fit.
- 2) For an anonymous search, answer a few questions to get matched with an extensive list of care providers at <u>caresolace.org</u>.

Another resource available is Gaggle Therapy. Since the start of the 2021-2022 school year, WRPS has contracted with Gaggle Therapy to provide therapy services to students as a way to address the local counselor shortage. Gaggle Therapy provides secure video platform-based mental health and support services to students, facilitated by licensed therapists and counselors who are experienced in working with children and teenagers. With parental consent, students participate in 45-minute weekly video therapy sessions. All FERPA and HIPAA guidelines are adhered to, and there are no costs for families or parents. For more information, please reach out to your child's school counselor.

Additionally, WRPS has partnered with several local agencies to provide in person individual and/or small group support. These supports are available in many of our schools. Please reach out to your child's school counselor to learn more about what is offered at school.

If you or a family member is seeking counseling-related services, please consider reaching out to Care Solace assistance or to your child's school counselor.
