Vaping and Nicotine Products

The use of vaping and nicotine products is a student health concern at LHS. While we know that the vast majority of students choose not to use these products, we are finding enough use in the building to know that many of our students are vulnerable to these companies' marketing and their destructive products. Students who use them are not only putting their health in jeopardy, they are risking serious disciplinary action. We have school policies against the use of vaping and nicotine products with the goal of keeping them out of our building, but we need your help.

The negative health effects of vaping and nicotine products are obvious, but understudied. Both products are addictive and contain chemicals, such as formaldehyde, which are essentially poison. They create dependency and likely long term damage to lungs and the cardiovascular system. Since we don't yet have long term longitudinal studies on most of these products, some take that as a sign that they are not dangerous. That is a mistake. These products are bad for everyone, particularly our young people.

Vaping products began invading the US market in 2007 and their market share grew rapidly. According to the National Institute of Health, the use of these products by high school students *grew by 900% between 2011 and 2015*. Their fruity flavors appealed to the young people and they were (and remain) easier to get than traditional cigarettes. They give out less smoke, don't smell as bad, and are easy to conceal. Although companies have faced sanctions for marketing directly to vulnerable youth and laws have increasingly restricted sales to underage people, the appeal remains strong in our society, particularly among early adolescents. Fortunately, the numbers nationwide have begun to dip as interest has waned, but the business remains a multi-billion dollar industry.

Students at LHS can get into substantial trouble for vaping in school. We have vape detectors throughout the school and will respond if one goes off. We are allowed to ask for law enforcement to search a student if we have reasonable suspicion of possession or use of vaping products. Students who use a vape while underage can receive a citation, although we prefer to hold that open in order to convince students to take an anti-vaping course online to learn about the negative health consequences of these products. We work to avoid suspension for use of vaping products, but this can be the outcome if students use vapes which contain THC, distribute vapes to others, or use them repeatedly. We do not want to suspend anyone, but we cannot allow these products in our school.

A new development in this fight is the growth of the Zyn, or nicotine pouch, industry. This product has become very popular, very quickly. It is a small pouch which sits in a user's mouth and results in a powerful hit of addictive nicotine. It is also against the rules to use in school, but it is admittedly difficult to catch.

We are fighting back against this epidemic with education. Our students, led by Mrs. Gretchen Niedbalski from WRAMS and recently joined by Ms. Michelle Perry here at LHS, have pushed to implement a FACT group at LHS. The group will use education and positive messaging to fight vaping and nicotine use in our community. Check out their website at https://www.factmovement.org/ to learn more!

Please help us in this fight. Talk to your children about the dangers of vaping and nicotine use. Do not buy these products for any minors and spread the word to others you know to not either. Communicate with us if you hear of concerns and we'll address them. Our students deserve this for their own health and safety. Thanks for reading!

Hunters

Virtually every student needs as much time in school as possible. Absences for any reason cause lapses in progress for most students. We do, however, recognize that families often hunt together and that vacations are often planned around deer season. Therefore, if you must take students out of school for deer hunting, be aware that in order to have an "excused" absence for deer hunting, students must pick up and complete a "Prearranged Absence" form from the high school office, and return it to the office prior to their absence. Please remember that it is the student's responsibility to make up all work that is missed during their absence. Teachers may request exams to be taken before the absence. Please note: Be sure no hunting weapons are left in any area of your student's car including the trunk; it is against the law. Hunting is not an excused absence for those participating under the co-curricular code of conduct.

Students Leaving Early

We realize that students need to leave early periodically for appointments, etc. Parents/guardians can send a written note with your student in the morning to get a pass from the attendance clerk. Or, you can put your request in Skyward Attendance, however, keep in mind that it is not monitored every minute of the day, or you can call the office (press 2 for attendance).

We ask that you give us a **TWO-HOUR** notice before your student is to be dismissed. Keep in mind that office staff needs to prepare a pass, locate your student (which may be in lunch, phy ed, class, etc.), and get them to the office to be dismissed timely. Your student will not be able to leave their classroom without the written pass from the office.

ALL students **MUST** go to the office to sign out before they leave the building. You may pick up your student in the front lot between 7:45 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. If before or after that time, please pick them up in the student lot.

Student Absences

When your student is absent for any reason or coming in late, you should either report this absence by using Skyward, phoning in on the Attendance Line, or by sending a note. If you go through Skyward or call the Attendance Line, you do not need to send a note in with your student when they return. Only one of these methods is necessary.


Students coming in late MUST check in with the office to get a pass and sign in.










Yearbooks

Since this is a new tool, it will only work on recently added documents and those going forward. In the portfolio, anything that has the icon below (looks like an eyeball) can be translated to a different language:




- Click on the eyeball icon and the document will populate in English.

MyACT.org

ACT has an online platform called MyACT that allows students to access their scores, register for future tests, and more.

MyACT.org is a tool that allows students to register, schedule, and pay for future ACT tests, explore ACT test prep products, and access and send their scores to colleges and institutions of their choice. MyACT.org also contains free college and career planning tools to help students navigate their next steps and provides insight to their interests and how they align to their future goals.

Once the scoring process is completed, students will receive their scores in the mail, if they provided their correct mailing address during testing. Their scores will also be available in MyACT. Their mailed score report will contain a supplement providing them with information on how to create a MyACT account that will successfully link to their state testing scores, using their uniquely assigned ACT ID number included on their mailed report. If your students have trouble creating or accessing their scores, or if they created an account without using their ACT ID number, please have the students contact ACT Customer Care at https://www.act.org/content/act/en/contact-act.html for assistance.

November Newsletter From the Nurse

Colder weather seasons are coming upon us along with other viruses and illnesses. Please m sure you are sending appropriate outside clothing with your student (hats, gloves, winter jackets). Below are some ways to protect yourself and others from severe respiratory viruses. CDC recommends that all people use core prevention strategies. These are important steps you can take to protect yourself and others: more information by clicking on the links below.

- Stay up to date with <u>immunizations</u>
- Practice good <u>hygiene</u> (practices that improve cleanliness)
- Take steps for cleaner air
- When you may have a respiratory virus:
 - Use precautions to prevent spread
 - Seek health care promptly for testing and/or treatment if you have <u>risk factors for severe</u> illness; treatment may help lower your risk of severe illness
 - People with asthma may notice worsening symptoms: talk to your health care provider if your symptoms are not controlled (STUDENTS/PARENTS: remember to send inhalers to school with a doctor's order)

LHS/RCHS-BBS

Bridging Brighter Smiles will be providing dental care for students right here at LHS. The program is open to students in grades 9-12. Each student that enrolls will receive 2-3 visits per school year. Enrollment information was emailed home previously or you can register at https://enrollment.bbsmiles.org/. A paper copy is available, please ask the main office.

Immunizations-prepare for next school year:

If your child received any immunizations recently, please call/report that to your school nurse, so they can update accordingly. See below for "NEW" immunization requirements that went into effect starting the 2024-2025 school year. A parent may call the clinics to make a "nurse-only" appointment for vaccinations as long as they are up to date with their pediatrician visits. Be prepared for next school year! If your child should not receive immunizations for any reason, please fill out a waiver by clicking on this link Immunization Form. Return the completed paperwork to the nurse. If you have updated immunizations throughout the school year, please turn those into the nurse to be updated in our system.

For entry to kindergarten through seventh grades, students need:

- 4 doses of polio vaccine
- · 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox)*
- 3 doses of hepatitis B
- · 2 doses of MMR
- 4 doses of DTaP/DTP/DT/TD 1 Tdap at seventh grade

NEW • 1 MenACWY-containing vaccine at seventh grade***

For entry to 12th grade


