Now that routines are established, the teachers will introduce pieces of our math program, which is specifically designed for Pre-K students. The program, called *Bridges in Mathematics*, is a play-based approach to foundational math concepts. For example, the students will use Play-Doh to shape numerals and create visual representations of the value of the number. The teachers read books that incorporate math skills and teach games to students to reinforce skills. The teachers are excited to use this curriculum with our young learners!

Another piece of the *Bridges in Mathematics* program is a **daily** calendar and numeracy practice, known as Number Corner. The students will learn the concept of *today*, and will use patterning and counting to complete a series of daily activities using the calendar. Look for more information coming from your child's teacher.

What a joy it's been to see the children's smiling faces each day at Pitsch Early Learning Center. Our staff is dedicated to fostering a love of learning with our students. We look forward to another great month together.

CREATIVE CORNER

Activities to do at home to support your child's learning.



MOVEMENT

This one is perfect for little learners. After learning what it means to be nocturnal. Tell kids they are going to pretend to be bats. When the lights are on they'll curl up and pretend to be sleeping, and when the lights are off they'll pretend to swoop and soar through the room and "fly" around. Take turns letting kids be in charge of the lights for even more fun.

SING

Spend some time learning and practicing the Itsy Bitsy Spider. Act it out with movements. Then weave in some phonemic awareness by discussing the rhyming words in the song.



"Itsy Bitsy Spider" Lyrics

The itsy bitsy spider crawled up the water spout. Down came the rain, and washed the spider out. Out came the sun, and dried up all the rain, and the itsy bitsy spider went up the spout again"



Cut a pumpkin shape from paper. Write child's name on it. Cut it and put together like a puzzle. Name the letters.

SNACK

Have some snack time fun by building spiders for snack. Together brainstorm what would work best for the body and the legs. Then test out a few options.







Hi everyone! Hoping your first days back to school have been wonderful and you're all settling in for another fantastic year! :) A few reminders.....

Care plans for Health Conditions

Emails have been sent with paperwork if your student has been identified as having a health condition (food allergies, lactose intolerance, asthma, allergies to bee stings, seizure disorders, etc.)

Please make sure to fill these out and send them back as soon as possible, this is important to help keep your student safe while at school. If you haven't received an email (make sure to check your junk folder, if this is your first conversation with the nurse), please reach out.

Medications

Students requiring administration of prescription medication at school must have a **PHYSICIAN/ DENTIST ORDERS FOR ADMINISTERING PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION IN SCHOOL** form on file in the nurse's office. This form and additional health forms (seizure, migraine, food allergies, bee allergies) may be found on the WRPS Webpage <u>here</u>. Prescription medications need to be brought in before the first day of school to insure everything is in order. Any medication identified as a controlled substance, such as medication for treatment of ADD/ADHD, anxiety, or pain,

must be delivered to the school office by a parent, guardian, or other responsible adult. These medications must be in a pharmacy-labeled container, placed in a sealed envelope, labeled with your child's name, and if in pill form, the number of pills sent.

Medications classified as non-controlled substances, such as antibiotics, eye drops, and inhalers for treatment of asthma, may be sent to school with a student, although we prefer to have them before the first day of school. These medications must be in a pharmacy-labeled container, placed in a sealed envelope, labeled with your child's name, and if in pill form, the number of pills sent.

NOTES FROM THE NURSE

Elementary school students may not self-administer medications; this includes those purchased over-the-counter. <u>All medications brought to school</u> <u>must be given to the nurse/office staff in the original</u> <u>labeled bottle.</u>

If your student has a known food/bee allergy or history of seizures or migraines, please fill out the health forms that can be found on the WRPS Webpage <u>here</u> and return to the nurse before the first day of school so our staff can adequately treat your child as needed.

Vaccinations

Students preparing to start school or those going into 6th grade will need to be up to date on their immunizations (see list below). **Instead of waiting until your child's yearly wellness check, you can schedule a "nurse only" visit for needed vaccinations.** <u>Children</u> who do not have the required vaccines or waiver on file will be excluded from school after 2 legal notices have been sent. If you don't plan to immunize your student there is a waiver available that must be filled out and returned before the start of the next school year (You can open the link <u>here</u>).

Age/Grade Required Immunizations (Number of Doses) 2 years through 4 years

4 DTP/DTaP/DT, 3 Polio, 1 MMR, 1 Var, 3 Hep B, 3 Hib4, 3 PCV5

Kindergarten through grade 6

4 DTP /DTaP/DT/Td1, 4 Polio, 2 MMR, 2 Var3, 3 Hep B

Grade 7 through grade 8

4 DTP/DTaP/DT/Td, 1 Tdap2, 4 Polio, 2 MMR, 2 Var3, 3 Hep B

Grade 9 through grade 12

4 DTP/DTaP/DT/Td, 1 Tdap2, 4 Polio, 2 MMR, 2 Var3, 3 Hep B

PLEASE make sure to turn in any paperwork for your student's vaccinations before October 16th, to avoid exclusion from school!!


COVID Guidelines

Students will just stay home if not feeling well and are unable to participate in class (or if they have a fever). If a fever is present, they should stay home until fever free for 24 hours (without using fever reducing medication). There are no masking stipulations. We are not tracking cases at all.
