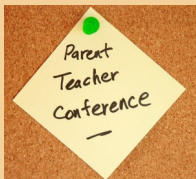

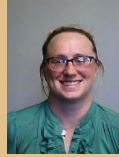
# LOOK WHO'S NEW

- Plagiarism is doing another person's work for him/her.
- Plagiarism is buying, selling, or giving work, questions, or answers.
- Plagiarism is proving another person with answers to homework, tests, quizzes, or written work (essays, paragraphs, journals, projects, etc.)
- Plagiarism is copying or stealing teachers' answer keys or teacher's edition texts.
- Plagiarism is, at any time, sharing with others one's final graded work whether digital or print.
- Plagiarism and the Use of AI Language Models: The use of AI language models like ChatGPT (or others) to generate content for academic assignments is strictly prohibited unless approved by the classroom teacher. Any student found to be using AI language models to generate content for academic assignments will be subject to school consequences.

There are several upcoming events your child(ren) can participate in to help them figure out their future!! Have them stop in to see Mrs. King in the ACP Center for more information on the following events:

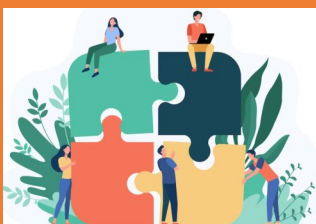
- ⇒ ASVAB testing (10-12 grade only): October 17th, 12:00 pm-3:00 pm (approximately)

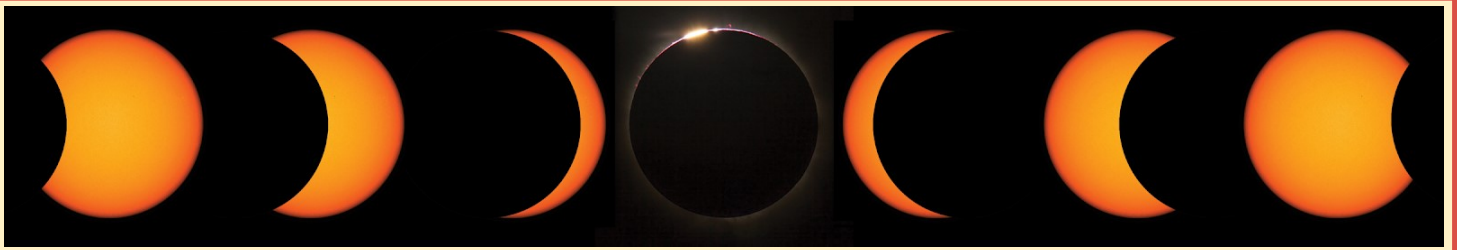

## SOLAR ECLIPSE

On Saturday, October 14, a partial solar eclipse will be visible in Wisconsin Rapids. The eclipse will begin when the moon starts to block the sun at 10:34 a.m. The eclipse will slowly build until 11:53 a.m., when the moon will cover 53% of the sun. After reaching its maximum, the eclipse will gradually wane until the moon clears the sun at 1:15 p.m.

Looking directly at the sun can cause permanent vision loss, even during a partial solar eclipse. Sunglasses, X-ray film, and most welding shields will not block enough light to protect your vision. However, there are safe ways to view a solar eclipse.

WRPS staff will host students, families, and interested community members for eclipse viewing events on October 14. Stop in to use telescopes with solar filters, pinhole viewers, and other projection methods to view the eclipse safely. A limited number of eclipse glasses will be available to purchase for \$1.00 each. On the east side of Rapids look for us in the student parking lot at Lincoln High School. On the west side you'll find us in the YMCA parking lot.

Eclipses are sensational and rare, and if the weather cooperates we have the chance to view one from beginning to end. We hope you'll join us for a memorable viewing experience.

You can also receive grading emails for your student. Once in Family Access click on "My Account" and check the box "Receive Grading Emails for my students". You will receive the following information through email on a daily basis:

- Missing Assignments
- Low assignment/class grade percent is 70% or less

You should also check the Message Center on Family Access regularly for important messages. Being informed about your student's progress and attendance will help you support academic success!

## What is Bright by Text ?

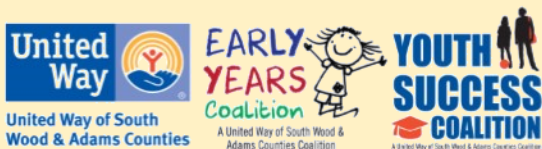
Bright by Text is a free program that sends tips and resources for healthy child development to parents' & caregivers' cell phones.

## Vaccinations

As you have seen in the past few newsletters, we will be excluding non-compliant students this year. The first legal notice was mailed on Sept. 25. If you received a notice, but believe your student is compliant with their vaccinations/[waivers](#), please contact your nurse. Deadline for compliance is October 16, 2023. Vaccines required for grades 9-12 are: 4 DTP/DTaP/DT/Td, 1 Tdap2, 4 Polio, 2 MMR, 2 Var3, 3 Hep B.

## Attendance

ALL students participating in a Co-Curricular Program, such as a Sport, School Group, or Club must be present in school ALL DAY in order to participate in the event, sport, or contest. Failure to be in attendance will result in non-participation in all co-curricular events that day. Absences which have been excused for a funeral, court appearance, school approved trips, **documented medical appointments**, exercising your right to vote, other unusual or extenuating circumstances or family emergencies must be cleared with the principal and/or athletic director in advance. Hunting or fishing is not an exception.

## Student Absences

Parents MUST call in their child's absences (whether excused or unexcused) to the Attendance Line at 715-424-6765, report the absence in Family Access, or by pressing 2 when calling 715-424-6750.

During the school day, students who leave school or arrive late to school MUST have parent's permission. If the student is leaving early you can send a note with your student or call our office. Please give us ample time to write a pass and locate your student so they will be ready when you are planning to pick them up. DO NOT text or call your student to leave early, they will not be able to leave class without a pass from the office.

All students will need to sign in (if they are late) or sign out (if they must leave) at the attendance window in the main office.

## From the Nurse....

Please be sure you are sending appropriate outside clothing with your student as the temperatures will be dropping. Along with weather changes comes illness.

Your student should not attend school if they have a temperature of 100.4 or greater, vomiting, and/or diarrhea, or if they are just not feeling well enough to attend school. They need to remain home for 24 hours fever-free without using fever-reducing medications and be vomit/diarrhea-free for 24 hours after the last episode.

Also, if your student has had a history of asthma and needs an inhaler, please be sure they have it at school and an order on file from the doctor. Asthma exacerbation/flare-up is very common due to weather changes.

### RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus)

A common respiratory virus that usually causes mild cold-like symptoms. Most people recover in a week or two, but RSV can be serious. A nasal swab can be taken to confirm RSV at any clinic.

Symptoms usually include:

- ⇒ Runny Nose
- ⇒ Decrease in appetite
- ⇒ Coughing
- ⇒ Sneezing
- ⇒ Fever
- ⇒ Wheezing

### Influenza (Flu)

Influenza is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat, and sometimes the lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness. A nasal swab can be taken to confirm influenza at any clinic.

Symptoms usually include:

- ⇒ Fever/Chills
- ⇒ Cough
- ⇒ Sore Throat
- ⇒ Runny/Stuffy Nose
- ⇒ Muscle/Body Aches
- ⇒ Headaches
- ⇒ Fatigue
- ⇒ Vomiting/diarrhea

### COVID

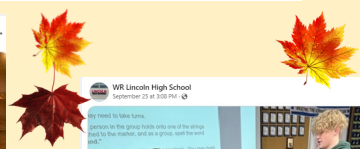
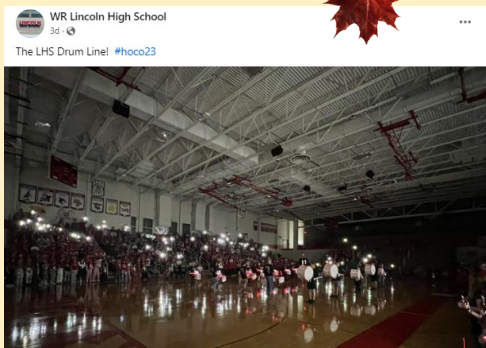
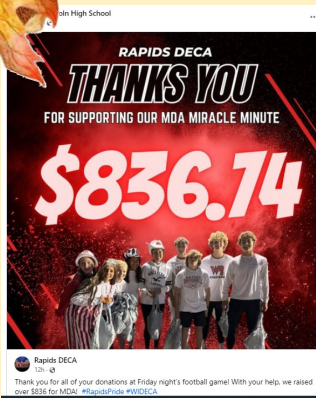
COVID is a contagious respiratory illness caused by SARS-COV-2, a coronavirus discovered in 2019. The virus spread mainly from person to person through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes, or talks. Some people who are infected may not have any symptoms at all. A nasal swab can be taken at home or any clinic to confirm COVID.

If your student tests positive for COVID they may attend school as long as they are fever-free without the use of medication, and feeling well enough to attend school. Currently, there is no masking requirement, but if they feel more comfortable wearing one that is fine.

Symptoms usually include:

- ⇒ Fever/Chills
- ⇒ Cough
- ⇒ Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- ⇒ New loss of taste or smell
- ⇒ Fatigue
- ⇒ Muscle/Body Aches
- ⇒ Headaches
- ⇒ Sore Throat
- ⇒ Congestion or Runny Nose
- ⇒ Nausea or vomiting/Diarrhea
