FROM THE PRINCIPAL



Hello and Happy Homecoming Week! I hope everyone reading this is doing well and enjoying the beautiful weather we've had lately! In this submission I want to discuss Parent Teacher Visitations (PTVs). I see them as a potential difference-maker for students, but they are sometimes undervalued. Let's see if I can help a bit with that.

Parent participation in face-to-face meetings has been declining in public high schools for many years. Now that class grades can be updated in real time, class assignments can be tracked in Canvas (see instructions later in the newsletter for that), and communication can be streamlined outside of formal conferences, many parents don't see the value in them. Also, I suspect the fact that parents are working more hours than ever contributes to a scheduling challenge that is difficult to overcome. This is why every principal I know is generally unhappy with the turnout at conferences. However, just look in the full stands during athletic events or student performances and you'll see there is no shortage of enthusiasm or support for our young people. The problem has more to do with the perceived value of such conferences.

I firmly believe if these meetings include the student, are focused on what is going well, and positive in nature, they'll have a strong benefit for everyone. I encourage all parents to sign up for the PTVs you are invited to attend through ParentSquare. All invitations should go out on Tuesday, October 1st at the end of the school day. We will be here from 4:00 to 6:30 p.m. and will meet with parents in five minute increments. Although the meetings are short, they are still valuable. Parents and teachers will get to know each other a bit, which will help with communication if any issues should arise. Students will get a chance to show the good work they are doing, enhancing their confidence and buy-in towards their own education. If there are any concerns with current performance, everyone can get on the same page and work together for a solution.

You can also meet with me during PTVs if you have time. Use the invitations I've sent out through ParentSquare to claim a spot. If they fill up or a different night works better for you, just send me an email and I'll get something set up. The few conversations I've had with parents recently, particularly since our social media threat and resulting Code Yellow last week, have really helped me to see things from the perspective of a parent. I look forward to more of these conversations.

I hope we're able to see most of our students and their parents during PTVs on October 14th. I know this can help our school and students. Please let me know if you have any questions or need any help setting up a meeting with our teachers.

Important // Vaccinations // NEW Requirements! 2024-2025

-WRPS Nurses-

ALL VACCINATIONS DUE NO LATER THAN 10/14/2024. EXCLUSION FROM SCHOOL STARTS 10/15/2024.

Instead of waiting until your child's yearly wellness check, you can schedule a "nurse only" visit for needed vaccinations. <u>NEW requirement changes</u> per the Wisconsin Department of Health Services are starting in the 2024-2025 school year. **PLEASE, read all of the information.** For full information on the new immunization requirements visit this link <u>Immunization Requirements</u>.

NEW Required Immunizations

**The change will go into effect for school-age children at the start of the 2024-2025 school year.

For entry to kindergarten through seventh grades, students need:

- 4 doses of polio vaccine
- 3 doses of hepatitis B
- 4 doses of DTaP/DTP/DT/TD
- 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox)*
- 2 doses of MMR
- 1 Tdap at seventh grade

NEW • 1 MenACWY-containing vaccine at seventh grade***

For entry to 12th grade

NEW • 1 MenACWY-containing booster (2nd dose in series)***

Note: A second dose of MenACWY-containing vaccine should be administered between the ages of 16 and 18 years to students who received the first dose of MenACWY-containing vaccine between the ages of 11 and 15 years. A second dose is <u>not</u> required for students who received their first dose of the MenACWY-containing vaccine at age 16 years or older.

*IF YOU MADE AN APPOINTMENT FOR VACCINATIONS, PLEASE LET YOUR SCHOOL NURSE KNOW IT'S IN PROCESS, AND TURN IN VACCINATION RECORD AFTER.

*Parents or adult students may still claim a personal conviction, medical, or religious waiver for these new requirements.

NEW MenACWY

***Starting with the 2024/25 school year students entering 7th grade and 12th grade will need to provide documentation of receiving the MenACWY-containing vaccine. Students entering grades 8 -11 during the 2024/25 school year will not be affected, and will <u>not</u> be required to have documentation of MenACWY. Students entering 12th grade will need two MenACWY vaccines and those entering 7th grade will need one MenACWY. Those 12th graders who received their first dose of a MenACWY-containing vaccine at age 16 or older are not required to have a booster, only the first MenACWY-containing vaccine. <u>Families are able to sign</u> <u>medical, religious, or personal conviction waivers for this</u> <u>requirement.</u>

NEW Varicella

Starting with the 2024/25 school year and moving forward in subsequent years, any new enterer in early childhood, 4K, or students K-12 who are claiming an exception to the varicella vaccination requirement because they had chickenpox disease will **need** to meet the verification requirement of such disease. This verification must be provided by a qualified health care provider (M.D., D.O., N.P, or P.A.). **New enterer:** means any student enrolling in a Wisconsin school for the first time. This typically means all pre-K and kindergarten students, and students transferring from an out-of-state (non-Wisconsin) school.

Students enrolled during the 2023/24 school year who have parental reports of chickenpox disease are not required to submit verification of such disease by a qualified health care provider unless the status of the student changes such as they move out of state and then re-enroll.

Parents may contact Wood County Public for information about the Immunization Clinic at 715-421-8911 to see if their child is eligible. See brochure for more information. <u>English & Spanish Brochure</u>.



For the 2024 book, we will use color portraits. They must meet these specifications:

0	Head and shoulder shot only; no extreme close-ups or full body shots
0	No hands in the portrait
0	No props such as hats, hobby paraphernalia, sports uniforms, or pets, Plain or subdued
	background – outdoor sittings, while popular, often create glare that is distracting.
0	Appropriate clothing (no deeply-cut necklines, off-shoulder shirts, or inappropriate messages)
0	No text or special effects
0	No black and white photos only color photos should be submitted.

Should the student select a portrait that does not meet these specifications, we reserve the right to reject it, and the student will be asked to have another portrait taken.

Our FIRM deadline for accepting photographs is November 30, 2024. The school takes ID photos every year, and we will use the ID photo if we do not receive one by the deadline. Due to the trimester schedule, we cannot extend due dates.
