1st Grade Goal: Demonstrate fluency with addition and subtraction through 10.

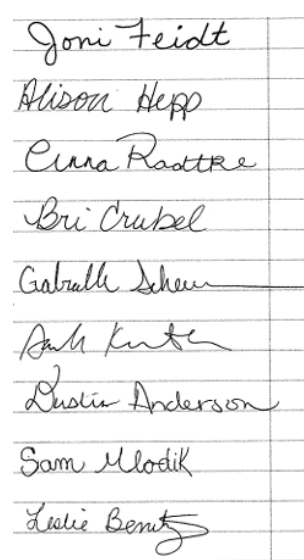
2nd Grade Goal: Demonstrate fluency with addition and subtraction through 20.
