School Learning Objective

Reading:

By June 2026, 85% of students in 4K-5th grades who attend THINK Academy at least 90% of the school year:

- 4K students
 - will be able to identify 4/26 letter sounds on the 4K district assessment.
- Kinderaarten students
 - will be able to identify 30/30 letter sounds on the kindergarten district assessment.
- 1st grade students
 - will be able to decode 39 or more nonsense words on the aimsweb nonsense word fluency assessment.
- 2nd grade students
 - will be able to read 96 or more words in one minute on the aimsweb oral reading fluency assessment.
- 3rd-5th grade students
 - will meet or exceed the 50th percentile on grade level CKLA reading fluency passages.
- Students who have IEP goals will make progress according to their reading goals.

Math:

By June 2026, 85% of students in grades K-5 who attend THINK Academy at least 90% of the school year will increase their number fluency to a mastery level:

- Kindergarten students
 - will solve addition and subtraction facts efficiently within 10, scoring 8 out of 10 on each assessment
- 1st grade students
 - will solve addition and subtraction facts efficiently within 10, scoring 18 out of 20 on each assessment (given 2 minute/assessment)
- 2nd grade students
 - will solve addition and subtraction facts efficiently within 20, scoring 36 out of 40 on each assessment (given 3 minutes for addition; 4 minutes for subtraction)
- 3rd grade students
 - will solve multiplication facts efficiently within 100, scoring 18 out of 20 on the assessment (given 3 minutes/assessment)
- 4th grade students
 - will solve multiplication and division facts efficiently within 100, scoring 38 out of 40 on each assessment (given 3 minutes/assessment)
- 5th grade students
 - will solve multiplication and division facts efficiently within 100, scoring 92 out of 100 on each assessment (given 5 minutes/assessment)
- Students who have IEP goals will make progress according to their math goals.
