RESOLUTION TO EXCEED REVENUE LIMIT FOR ONE YEAR (NON-RECURRING) TO FUND ENERGY EFFICIENCY AND OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCY PROJECTS

Be it resolved that the School District of Wisconsin Rapids is exercising its taxing authority under s. 121.91 (4) (o), Wis. Stats., on or before October 1st, to exceed the revenue limit on a non-recurring basis by an amount the District will spend on new energy efficiency measures and energy efficiency products for projects in the 2017-18 school year.

The amount to be expended:

After review of the recommendations report per s. 66.0133 (2) (b), Stats., the District has determined that the \$2,645,388 it would spend on energy efficiency projects recommended in the report is not likely to exceed the amount to be saved in annual utility costs of \$3,357 and non-utility costs of \$207,310 over the remaining forty year useful life of the facility to which the measures apply.
