

School Safety

We regularly practice safety drills at Mead School. Fire drills, code yellows, and evacuation drills are a part of what we do to ensure students and staff are prepared in case of an emergency. Occasionally, we have to perform a "code yellow" soft lockdown, which means we have a **minor** situation happening in the halls and need to keep students away. This allows us to respect students' privacy and keep everyone else learning and going about their business with as little disruption as possible.
